

Visiting Strawberry Hill House & Garden

Getting Here

By Train

If you're travelling by train, you will want to arrive at Strawberry Hill station. From the station, it's a short walk of 5-10 minutes to the house.



By Bus

If you're travelling by bus, this is the nearest stop - from here it's only a very short walk of 1 to 2 minutes to the house.



By Car

If you're travelling by car, then this is our free car park - we currently have three dedicated disabled parking spaces.



On arrival


The entrance to Strawberry Hill House is at the back of the house or via the shop.

Our Staff and volunteers wear red lanyards, if you need any help during your visit, please speak to one of our friendly team.



If you haven't pre-booked your tickets online, you can purchase a ticket on arrival.

You can also ask for a map to help you navigate, as well as a brief history of the house and garden.



Facilities

Wheelchair

If you require a wheelchair - there is one available to borrow for free. Please ask a member of staff for assistance.




Garden Café

Accessibility


Our Lift

To begin your journey and explore Strawberry House, walk up the staircase in the main entrance hall - or take the lift to the first floor.

There are many highlights to see at Strawberry Hill House including the Gallery and Round Room on the first floor and the Library on the second floor.




Visiting the Garden
